SUBJECT: AUTHORIZE THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO ENTER INTO AND EXECUTE THE AGREEMENT AND REQUIRED PROGRAM DOCUMENTS WITH THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AND ADOPT THE 43rd AMENDMENT TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION NO. 2010-138 APPROPRIATING \$200,000 FOR THE SOBRIETY CHECKPOINT MINI-GRANT PROGRAM FOR 2010-2011

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Council authorize the Chief of Police to enter into and execute the agreement and required program documents with the Regents of the University of California and, adopt the 43rd amendment to the Annual Appropriation Resolution No. 2010-138 to appropriate \$200,000 for the Sobriety Checkpoint Mini-Grant Program for 2010-2011.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Fresno has been awarded \$241,078 from the Regents of the University of California to undertake the Sobriety Checkpoint Mini-Grant Program for 2010-2011. The grant period is from November 1, 2010, through September 6, 2011. The grant will fund overtime costs for checkpoint operations. Council approval is needed to authorize the agreement, and appropriate \$200,000 into the FY 2011 budget.

BACKGROUND

The Sobriety Checkpoint Mini-Grant Program for 2010-2011 will fund overtime costs for the Fresno Police Department to conduct sobriety checkpoints in the fight against Driving Under the Influence (DUI).

Studies have shown that extensive checkpoint activity results in a substantial reduction in alcohol-related crashes, injuries, and deaths in the communities in which they are held. Law enforcement officers are able to systematically stop drivers to assess their level of alcohol impairment. In addition, these checkpoints put the public on notice that law enforcement is watching.

One of the most Important requirements for deterring potential drunk drivers is to convince the public that if they drive while impaired, there is a strong likelihood that they will be detected and arrested. If checkpoints are set up frequently, over long enough periods and are well publicized, they can establish a convincing threat in people's minds that impaired drivers will be apprehended.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no negative impact to the general fund.
