




SUBJECT: RECOMMEND CITY COUNCIL APPROVE AMENDMENT II INCREASING CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH KRAZAN AND ASSOCIATES INC. TO \$180,000 FOR ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS, PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES

KEY RESULT AREA

One Fresno

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends City Council approve Amendment II increasing consultant services agreement with Krazan and Associates Inc. to \$180,000 for environmental services for affordable housing projects, programs and activities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Housing and Community Development Division routinely uses environmental consultant services to perform on-demand environmental assessments for the City's affordable housing activities including those funded with Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program funds. Completion of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) environmental review process is mandatory under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program. In addition, phase one environmental assessments and California Environmental Policy Act (CEQA) environmental reviews are also required for many of the division's activities. The City annually awards environmental review contracts with one to two companies through a competitive Request for Proposal (RFP) process. The City currently has an agreement with Krazan in the amount of \$80,000. The agreement is in effect until December 31, 2008, however, all funds have been expended. Amendment II will increase the compensation amount to \$180,000. The \$100,000 dollar amount increase is expected to cover the environmental assessment services throughout fiscal year 2007-2008.

KEY OBJECTIVE BALANCE

Approval of the increase presents an opportunity to make a positive impact to the Customer Satisfaction, Employees Satisfaction, and Financial Management Key Objectives. The approval impacts the Customer Service aspect by demonstrating the City's commitment to ensuring affordable housing projects comply with the City and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development environmental review process. The approval also attributes to Employee Satisfaction by authorizing the necessary consultant services be obtained in order to complete housing projects. In addition, it demonstrates Financial Management through prudent oversight and compliance with City contracting and procurement procedures.

BACKGROUND

The Housing and Community Development Division routinely uses environmental consultant services to perform on-demand environmental assessments for the City's affordable housing activities, projects and programs including those utilizing Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program funds. Completion of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) environmental review process is mandatory under the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) Program. A Phase I and California Environmental Policy Act (CEQA) environmental review process is required for some of the Division's other project activities such as City property acquisitions for future development of affordable housing. Since the City utilizes, in part, HOME or other public funds for affordable housing, all projects whether developed or not, require environment assessments to be conducted.

The City annually awards environmental review contracts with one to two companies through a competitive Request for Proposal (RFP) process to provide environmental consultant services during the program year. Since Krazan was again selected to provide services for 2007-2008 and its Amendment I is still in effect until December 31, 2008, Amendment II will only increase the compensation amount from \$80,000 to \$180,000. The \$100,000 dollar amount is expected to cover the environmental assessment services throughout fiscal year 2007-2008.

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME funds are used to fund the subject consultant services agreement. If a conceptual project becomes a Council-approved HOME-funded project, then HOME funds are utilized. If a conceptual project does not come to fruition, then CDBG funds are utilized.

FISCAL IMPACT

HOME and CDBG funds for the proposed contract amendment are available in the Planning and Development Department's FY 2007-08 Budget.

EXHIBIT A
AMENDMENT NO. II TO AGREEMENT

THIS AMENDMENT NO. II TO AGREEMENT, is made and entered into effective July 1, 2007, by and between the CITY OF FRESNO, a municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as "City"), and KRAZAN AND ASSOCIATES, INC., a California corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Consultant".)

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City and Consultant entered into an Agreement, dated December 31, 2006, as once amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"), for professional services in relation to on-demand environmental assessment/services for unspecified City development/housing projects as more particularly described therein, (hereinafter collectively the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to modify the Agreement to increase the not-to-exceed contract amount from \$80,000 to \$180,000, upon the terms and conditions herein.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals, which recitals are contractual in nature, the mutual promises herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. The not-to-exceed contract amount shall be \$180,000.
2. All capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to such terms in the Agreement.
3. In all other regards, the Agreement as amended by this Amendment No. II shall be and remain in full force and effect.
