Key Training Points:

- Unpredictable walking surfaces are virtually everywhere in the construction industry, so slips and falls are a particular problem. Floors are often slippery with grease, ice or mud.
- You can prevent falls by watching out for slipping and tripping hazards and avoiding them or eliminating them.
- Construction workers need to wear appropriate footwear at all times.
- Keeping the area free of slipping and tripping hazards is the way to prevent injuries and deaths from slips and falls.
- Keep debris, hoses and extension cords out of high traffic areas.
- When unexpected obstacles combine with visibility problems, falls are bound to happen, so clear a path or ask for guidance if you will be walking while your vision is obscured.
