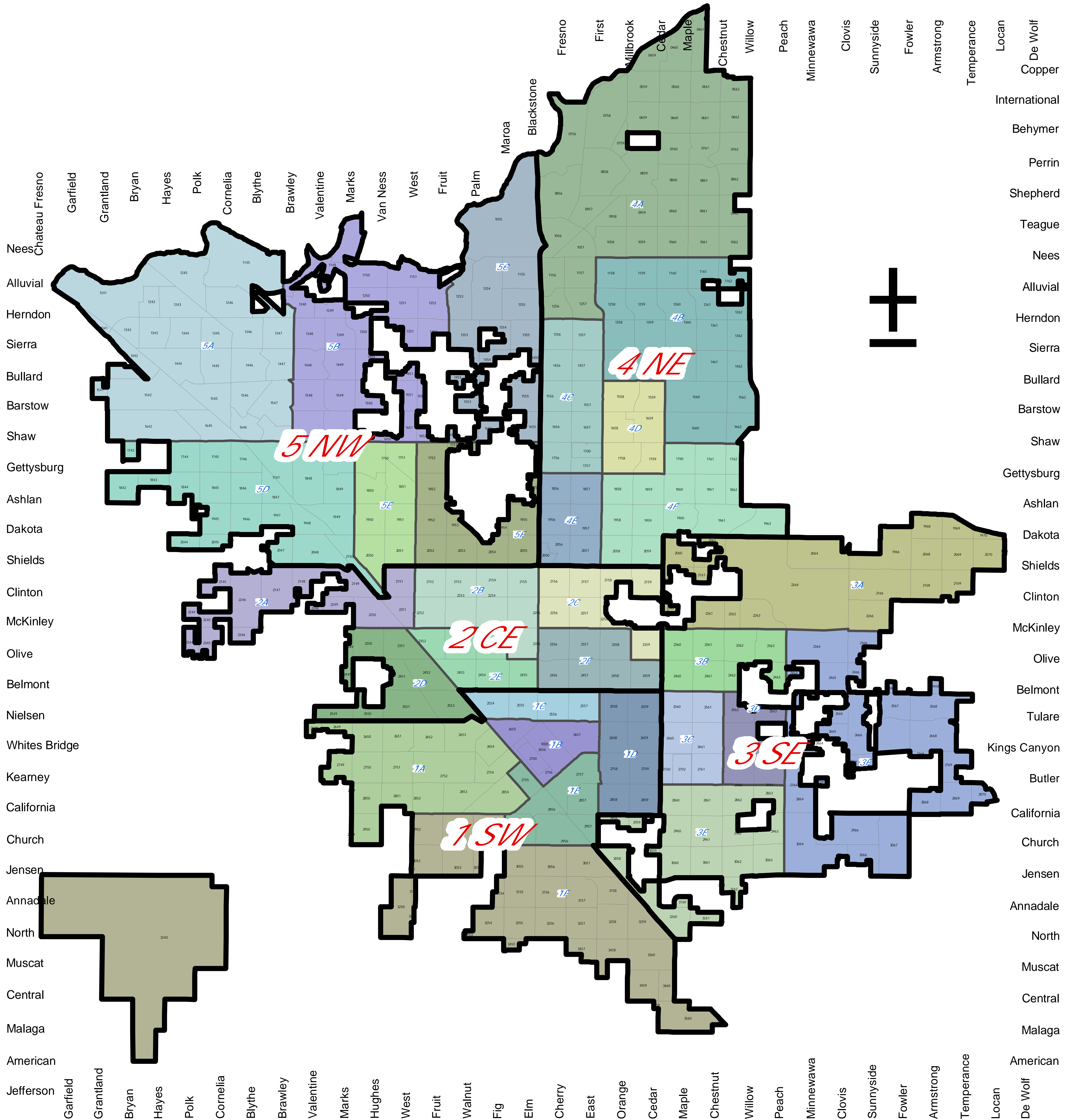

Note (-2) \* Note, a preliminary report was released to PIO in February 2002. This report reflected that there were 421,568 CFS for Year 2001. Further inspection to assess the validity of the data revealed that this information was derived directly using a default Data911 internal report. Analysis by programming staff in Police-ISB revealed that the results in using this program provides information inclusive of not only unique Police Events; but, also Fire Calls and multiple Police event transactions. The result of this initial (pre-audit) condition provided an inaccurate representation of the CFS data. The correct data as of 3/22/2002 is reflected in the
