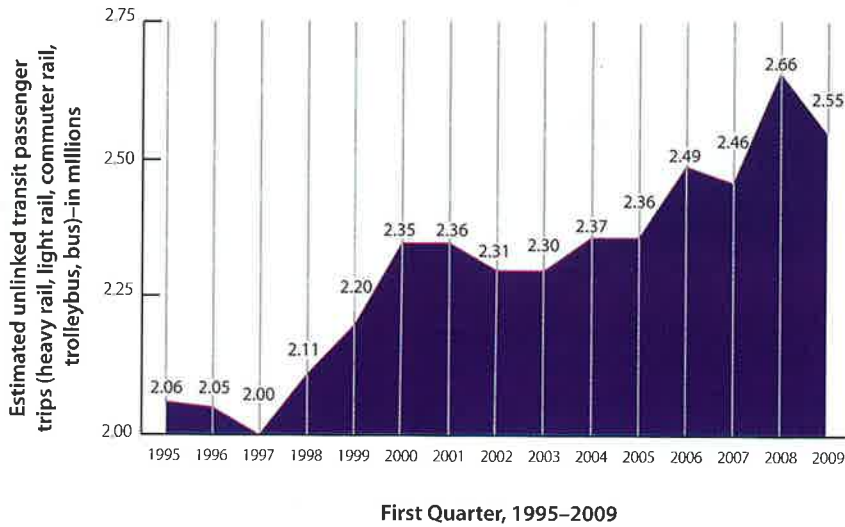

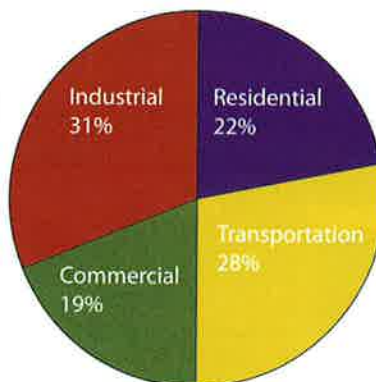
Household Transportation Costs
