For each matter considered by the Commission, there will first be a staff presentation, followed by a presentation from the project applicant. Testimony from supporters of the project will then be taken, followed by testimony from those in opposition. The applicant will have the right to a final rebuttal presentation prior to closing the public hearing.

In accordance with Section 13 of Article 2 of the Planning Commission Rules and Regulations governing length of public debate, all public testimony from those in support and in opposition of the project will be limited to three minutes per person. The three lights on the podium next to the microphone will indicate the amount of time remaining for the speaker. The green light will be turned on when the speaker begins. The yellow light will come on with a soft bell ring when one minute is remaining. The speaker should be completing the testimony by the time the red light comes on with a final bell indicating time has expired. All public testimony must be presented to the Commission at the podium.

If you challenge these land use matters in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised in oral or written testimony at or before the close of the hearing.

VIII. NEW MATTERS

A. CONTINUED TO NOVEMBER 5, 2014

Consider an appeal of the Development and Resource Management Department Director's action to approve Conditional Use Permit Application No. C-14-040, which proposes the installation of an 80-foot high unmanned wireless communications slimline monopole tower with nine panel antennas inside a radome, a diesel standby generator and an equipment enclosure. The proposed facility is required to meet with all FAA and FCC requirements. The property is in the C-P/UGM/cz (Administrative and Professional Office/Urban Growth Management /conditions of zoning) zone district. The address of the site is 1506 East Champlain Drive C/T.

1. APPROVE Environmental Assessment No. C-14-040 finding that the proposed project is exempt from CEQA through Class 32 and Class 3 Categorical Exemptions.
