

In December 1999, a new CAD/RMS system was brought in which did not accurately capture DER larceny counts, resulting in lower than normal larceny count. It was discovered that the new RMS/CAD system resulted in several months of duplicate values. These duplicate values inflated the crime [2] A preliminary report was released to the PIO in February 2002. This report reflected 421,568 CFS for 2001. Further analysis revealed this information was derived using a Data911 internal report which included not only unique police events, but also fire events. The correct data as of 3/22/2002 is reflected in the above table.
