SUBJECT: FALL 2019 STUDENT CONTACT ANALYSIS (SCA)

This Student Contact Analysis (SCA) report provides an analysis of documented student contacts at the 14 Fresno Unified School District (FUSD) middle schools, one continuation high school, and one elementary school where Student and Neighborhood Resource Officers (SRNOs) are staffed. The SNRO unit is a partnership between the Fresno Police Department and the Fresno Unified School District. The unit has officers assigned to DeWolf Continuation High School, Ahwahnee, Baird, Computech, Cooper Academy, Gaston, Hamilton, Kings Canyon, Scandinavian, Sequoia, Tehipite, Tenaya, Terronez, Tioga, and Yosemite Middle Schools. The unit also has one officer assigned to Manchester Gate Elementary School.

SCA reports are published at the conclusion of each school semester. This SCA report covers the reporting period for August through December 2019 (fall semester). The SCA data contained in this analysis is generated by reporting mechanisms required of SNROs and maintained by the sergeant assigned to the SRO unit. Citation and arrest data is also maintained automatically in the Department's Report Writer Systems under each officer's identification. The SCA report may contain a slight variance in statistical data.

The total student population is 11,311 school age youth in all campuses where SNROs are assigned for the spring semester. Demographic information and student populations were provided by each school site and represent a point in time analysis for December, 2019.

The demographic data used for the purposes of this report were obtained from the US Census Bureau website;

The demographic breakdown of the City of Fresno used for Demographic Data Analysis, as reported in the US Census Bureau's most recent published information, is as follows:

- Hispanic 49.1\%
- White 27.4\%
- Asian 13.6\%
- Black / African American 7.8\%
- Multiracial 4.3\%,
- American Indian / Alaskan Native 1.1\%,
- Hawaiian / Pacific Islander 0.1\%.

The demographic breakdown of the schools where SNRO's are assigned is as follows:

- Hispanic 68.20\%
- White 10.15\%
- Asian 9.33\%
- Black / African American 7.01\%
- Multiple races 2.87\%
- Native American 0.56\%
- Pacific Islander 0.41\%

A review of the statistical data maintained by the SNRO's for this reporting period showed there were a total of 188 reported crimes. Of the reported crimes, 6 were felonies, 159 were misdemeanors, and 23 were infractions reported for 11,311 students on the 16 campuses where SNROs are assigned. This represents that $1.66 \%$ of the student population (188 of 11,311 students) were involved in reported criminal activity during this period of analysis.

Of the 188 reported crimes, 2 juveniles were booked into the Fresno County Juvenile Justice Campus. Additionally, 86 students who were contacted by SNROs for being involved in low-level, non-violent criminal behavior were either reprimanded and released, referred to Youth Court, or were involved in peer mediation / restorative practices involving school staff. This equates to $45.74 \%$ of all crime-related contacts made by SNROs during this reporting period being diverted from the Juvenile Justice System through alternative resolutions and effective use of restorative practice techniques.

The demographic data of the 188 youth committing reported crimes during this analysis period is as follows:

- Hispanic 60.11\%
- Black 25.47\%
- White 10.64\%
- Asian 3.19\%
- Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 1.06\%
- Native American 0.53\%

The demographic data of the 86 youth reprimanded and released or involved in restorative practices, including peer mediation and Youth Court, is as follows:

- Hispanic 56.98\%
- Black 33.72\%
- White 9.30\%
- Asian 1.16\%
- Hawaiian/Pacific Islander 1.16\%

Of the 188 reported crimes that occurred for this analysis period on school campuses where an SNRO is assigned, the following crimes were reported most often:

- 69 violations of Penal Code 415 - fighting (36.70\% of the 188 reported crimes)
- 51 violations of Penal Code 242 / 243 - battery (27.13\% of the 188 reported crimes)
- 23 violations of Health and Safety Code 11357 - minor in possession of marijuana (12.23\% of the 188 reported crimes)

The data reflected in the current SCA report will be reviewed and then compared to the next SCA report to determine what modifications, if any, should be made to the Student and Neighborhood Resource Officer Unit to enhance its effectiveness.
