Route changes coming in January 2021!

In early January, two changes will go into effect: Route 12 will connect with Route 35 at Shields and Brawley, and the southern portion of Route 38 will begin to operate at 15-minute frequencies. This means that Routes 12 and 35 will operate as an "interline," similar to Routes 39 and 26, and that the entirety of Route 38 will run every 15 minutes. These changes and others will be reflected in the upcoming edition of the <u>FAX Schedule Guide</u>. The new services will go into effect on January 4, 2021.

A Reminder about COVID-19 Rules at FAX



As a result of the increase in positive COVID-19 cases in Fresno and across the nation, we wanted to remind our passengers about FAX rules that help protect riders and drivers.

Passengers are required to wear facial coverings at all times, and are asked to maintain a distance of 6 feet from other people. FAX and Handy Ride continue to operate on a regular schedule; however, we are limiting each fixed route bus to a maximum of ten passengers and Handy Ride vehicles to three passengers at a time. For fixed-

route service, FAX requests passenger self-screen; for Handy Ride, screenings

are conducted at the time of reservation and again when boarding the vehicles.

Do not board the bus if you:

- Have a fever (100.4F), feel warm, or feel chills
- Have a persistent cough, sore throat, or runny nose
- Have had contact or spent time with a suspected or known COVID-19infected individual.

If you meet any of these conditions, go home immediately and self-isolate.



When ready to bid, remember the following:

- View and double check the Bidder's Checklist
- Complete and submit all required documents. Projects with Federal funding have additional requirements
- Questions or exceptions must be submitted in advance on forms provided
- Contact with City staff is limited to Purchasing. No contact with City staff or Elected Officials outside of Purchasing is allowed during the bidding process
- Submit your Bid/Proposal ON TIME! Late submittals are not accepted.
