

What's New At FAX - March 2020

Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) update: FAX & Handy Ride will continue to operate on regular schedule during the Shelter in Place time. FAX will follow the advice of Public Health officials and practice social distancing, limiting each bus to a maximum of approximately 10 persons at one time. Please... maintain a distance of 6 feet from other people at all times.

Remember: To help avoid the spread of the novel coronavirus, don't

ride the bus if you feel sick, wash your hands frequently, and maintain six feet of distance with others. As you wait for the bus to arrive and as you board the bus, please respect the 6-foot distance.

What can FAX riders do to protect themselves against the novel coronavirus (COVID-19)?

here are things you can do to protect yourself and those around you. Actions include:

- · Stay home when you are sick.
- · Avoid touching your eyes.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based sanitizer with at least 50% alcohol.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, cough into your sleeve.
- Avoid contact with sick people.
- Maintain a distance of 6 feet from other people at all times.
- Use the touchless hand sanitizer dispenser on the buses.

What is FAX doing about the novel coronavirus (COVID-19)?

To help prevent the spread of novel coronavirus (COVID-19), FAX is limiting the number of passengers on each bus to approximately 10 people at one time; requesting social distancing of six feet; and wiping down all frequently touched areas in all buses every night. FAX also added hand sanitizers on all buses for our riders. We are also reminding our riders and drivers to wash hands frequently, avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth,

and avoid close contact with people who are sick. In addition, we are providing access to the latest public health information, and have added touchless hand sanitizer dispensers to our buses.
