October is Pedestrian Month

More than <u>7,500 pedestrians</u> were struck and killed by vehicles in 2022 in the United States, a 40-year high. <u>Forty-four</u> of these deaths were in Fresno County. Safety can be improved through infrastructure changes and traffic enforcement, in addition to increasing public awareness.

In 2020, the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) established October as Pedestrian Safety Month to remind drivers and pedestrians to respect each other and stay safe on the roads. FAX and the City of Fresno remind both drivers and pedestrians alike to look out for one another and be safe, not only in October, but every month.



FAX Adding Up to 22 Hydrogen Buses to the Fleet

As part of its plan to achieve a zero-emission fleet by 2040, FAX has secured funding to purchase up to 22 hydrogen fuel cells electric buses (FCEBs) by 2031. FAX was awarded \$22,450,000 and will provide matching funds of \$7,950,000 for a total of \$32.4 million.

In addition to purchasing up to 22 FCEBs, the funding will be used to develop hydrogen fueling infrastructure at the City of Fresno Municipal Service Center. The Municipal Service Center also houses electric charging infrastructure to support up to 46 battery electric buses (BEBs).

The new FCEBs will join the 2 hydrogen buses currently on order and the 9 BEBs already in the FAX zero-emission fleet.

What is a fuel cell electric bus?

When it comes to electric powertrains, there are two viable solutions: batteries and fuel cells. With a BEB, a battery stores energy, which is then used to power

the vehicle. Whereas, with an FCEB, a fuel cell generates energy by converting available fuel. In the case of a hydrogen FCEB, it is hydrogen that powers the bus, not the battery.
