

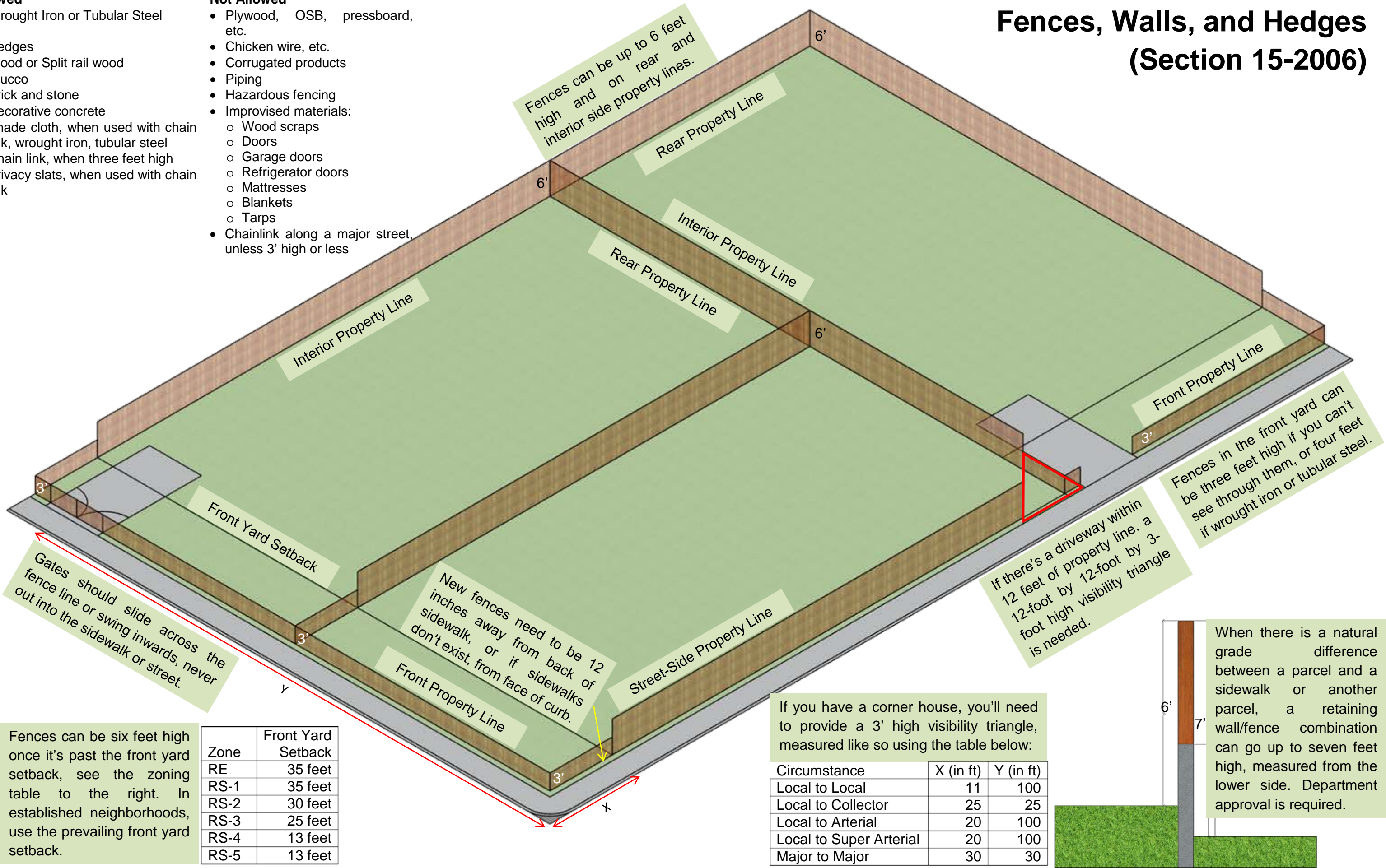
Materials Allowed

- Wrought Iron or Tubular Steel
- Hedges
- Wood or Split rail wood
- Stucco
- Brick and stone
- Decorative concrete
- Shade cloth, when used with chain link, wrought iron, tubular steel
- Chain link, when three feet high
- Privacy slats, when used with chain link

Not Allowed

- Plywood, OSB, pressboard, etc.
- Chicken wire, etc.
- Corrugated products
- Piping
- Hazardous fencing
- Improvised materials:
  - Wood scraps
  - Doors
  - Garage doors
  - Refrigerator doors
  - Mattresses
  - Blankets
  - Tarps
- Chainlink along a major street, unless 3' high or less

Fences, Walls, and Hedges (Section 15-2006)



Fences can be six feet high once it's past the front yard setback, see the zoning table to the right. In established neighborhoods, use the prevailing front yard setback.

Zone	Front Yard Setback
RE	35 feet
RS-1	35 feet
RS-2	30 feet
RS-3	25 feet
RS-4	13 feet
RS-5	13 feet

If you have a corner house, you'll need to provide a 3' high visibility triangle, measured like so using the table below:

Circumstance	X (in ft)	Y (in ft)
Local to Local	11	100
Local to Collector	25	25
Local to Arterial	20	100
Local to Super Arterial	20	100
Major to Major	30	30

When there is a natural grade difference between a parcel and a sidewalk or another parcel, a retaining wall/fence combination can go up to seven feet high, measured from the lower side. Department approval is required.
