

City of Fresno Street Work Permit FAQs

When is a street work permit required?

- A street work permit is required whenever there is proposed work in the City right-of-way.

How long does it take to get a permit?

- Please reference the [permitting process](#) document for an estimated time.

How do I submit an application?

- Applications are submitted through [FAASTER/ACA \(Accela Citizen Access\)](#).

Can I still submit a hard copy of the application?

- Hard copies will not be accepted, but assistance can be provided in the Public Works Department Fourth Floor or by calling 559-621-8800.

Note: Street work permits submitted via email will not be processed and will not receive a response.

What kind of insurance do I need?

- Certificate of insurance should include Commercial General Liability, Commercial Auto Liability, and Workers' Compensation. This link details the [insurance requirements](#).

Do I need a bond?

- Any work performed in the City of Fresno right of way requires a [bond](#).

Do I need to be a contractor?

- Permits are issued to licensed contractors only.

How do I pay for a permit?

- Payments can be made through [FAASTER/ACA \(Accela Citizen Access\)](#).

How much is a permit?

- Permit fees may vary depending on the proposed work.

How soon can I work after I get a permit?

- Once an approved traffic control plan (if required) and approved permit has been obtained by the City of Fresno, work can begin on the start date referenced on the approved traffic control plan. If a traffic control plan is not required, work may commence once the street work permit is approved.
