Are You Ready?

Before an emergency happens, we all need to take action and be prepared. Then if the emergency grows, and overwhelms the responders, a higher-level response team steps in to help and bring more resources and more expertise.

The layers of Preparedness/Response/Recovery build on each other to meet the needs of the communities affected.

Personal: Begin with individual preparation. Have a go bag (home, car, work) for the foundation or first step in the plan.

- ✓ Keep cell phone and other devices charged and ready to always ready to go.
- ✓ Become trained for emergency situations: CPR, First Aid, AED and make sure you and all family members learn to swim as drowning and on the water accidents are a common cause of injuries and fatalities.
- ✓ Be ready to rescue at your skill level when the scene is safe. At a minimum, you can always call 911.

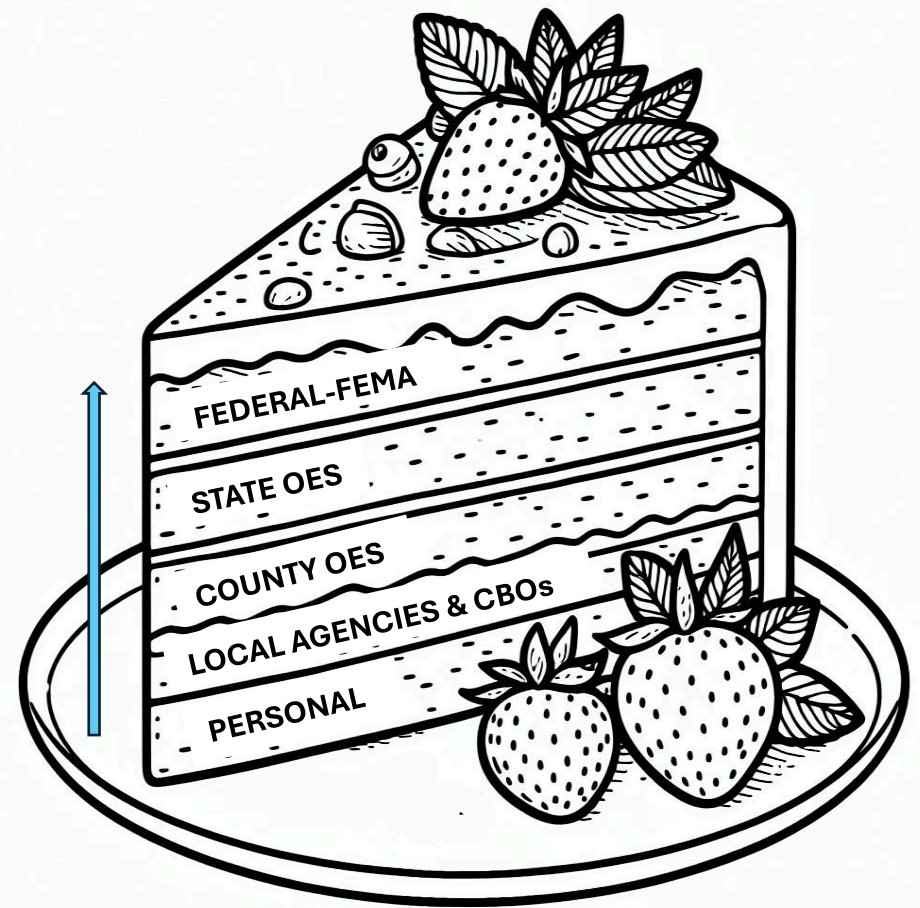
