

STREET SWEEPER LEAD OPERATOR**DEFINITION**

Under general supervision, operates a motor driven street sweeper and provides lead direction to other workers engaged in street and gutter cleaning operations.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED/EXERCISED

Receives supervision from the Division Manager or designee. This class provides lead direction to other street sweeper operators and workers engaged in street and gutter cleaning operations. The class does not exercise supervision.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

Street Sweeper Lead Operator is the advanced working/lead level class in the Street Sweeper Operator series. Incumbents operate a motor driven street sweeper to clean City streets and gutters and provides lead direction to other street sweeper operators and workers engaged in street and gutter cleaning operations. Incumbents may be assigned to any eight-hour shift. This class is distinguished from the Street Sweeper Operator in that incumbents of the latter do not have ongoing lead responsibility over other operators.

EXAMPLES OF IMPORTANT AND ESSENTIAL DUTIES

May include, but are not limited to, the following:

Provides lead direction to other street sweeper operators and workers engaged in street and gutter cleaning operations.

Operates a motor driven street sweeper in an assigned area to clean streets and gutters.

Services, cleans and makes minor adjustments/repairs to the street sweeper.

Cleans storm drains and gutters.

Performs seasonal leaf removal as needed.

Keeps daily records of work performed.

Participates in clean up operations across the City, including special events.

Handles customer complaints and provides excellent customer service.

Assists in median island clean up and removes hazards from streets.

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May perform minor maintenance and service such as changing brooms, checking and greasing components and mechanisms.

May participate in the creation and maintenance of the street sweeping routing program.

Performs related duties as required.

JOB RELATED AND ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of:

City geography and street locations

Storm drain maintenance procedures

Sweeper equipment as related to the work assigned.

Street and gutter cleaning operations and equipment.

Basic office and recordkeeping practices including computer usage.

Skill/Ability to:

Operate a motor vehicle safely.

Provide lead direction and training to other workers.

Read and understand street maps and sweeping routes

Make minor adjustments/repairs of sweeping equipment in the field.

Follow written and oral instructions.

Follow established safety procedures in the operation of a motor driven street sweeper.

Establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the performance of duties and the general public.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education:

Possession of a High School Diploma or equivalent GED completion.

Experience:

Three (3) years of experience equivalent to that gained as a Street Sweeper Operator with the City of Fresno.

Special Requirement(s):

Must possess a valid Commercial Class B California Driver's License without airbrake restriction at time of application and maintain the appropriate license for the entire term of employment in this classification.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

The physical demands described here are representative of those that are necessary to safely, effectively, and efficiently perform the essential functions of this job with or without reasonable accommodation.

This classification's physical demands involve heavy work exerting up to 100 pounds of force occasionally with assistance, and/or up to 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects. Additionally, the following physical demands may be required: balancing, climbing, crawling, crouching, feeling, manual dexterity, grasping, handling, hearing, kneeling, lifting, mental acuity, pulling, pushing, reaching, repetitive motion, speaking, standing, stooping, talking, visual acuity, walking.
